





# The Spirit of a City

Pune is the cultural capital of Maharashtra, India. It is one of the oldest city of India that shows the traditional evolutions of old Indian cities.

The brief aims at analysing the "Spirit" of Pune as per sociologist Patrick Geddes' theory of "Work-Folk-Place"

The theory states that for stable, healthy homes and for people to fully participate in life, it is necessary that there must be a close association of "work", "folk" and "place" in a city.



The spirit of the city is seen on the streets and in the hearts of the people.

The presence of a plethora of activities (Work), the emotions of the people (Folk) and their attachments (Place) contribute to the city's spirit.

The triad of temples (place), commercial areas (work) and residential areas (folk) is seen in adjacencies in the core city areas.

Raju, the main character is a young school boy. He has to complete the chores told by his mother while going home after playing with friends.


### **Main Objectives:**

To complete the chores


### **Secondary Objectives:**



Most of the time, kitchens are active spaces. They're an excellent subject with an organic composition of objects. was really fun capturing rare silent moments in the




